

**Force ota update**

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Google announced on August 15th, 2022, that it would begin rolling out the Android 13 update to its portfolio of Pixel devices. As is usual with Android updates, however, this doesn't mean that even if you have a qualifying Pixel device (a Pixel 4 or newer, basically), you'll immediately see the update available. Google often takes a number of weeks to deliver the update to all devices out there. While there's always the solution of using Android's developer tools, a Mac or PC, and a USB cable to sideload the update immediately, an easier, computer-free option exists as well. If you've got a qualifying Pixel device and are tired of seeing the software update screen say there's nothing new, here's a trick to force the update to show up.

Should I update to Android 13? If you're wondering if Android 13 brings a large difference to your phone from Android 12, I'm here to tell you that it doesn't change much. There are a couple of settings in different locations and the media player in the notification tray has been jazzed up a little. But by and large, it looks and functions very similarly to Android 12 on Pixel devices, right down to the customizable theming options. On the plus side, we've been running beta versions of Android 13 and have not run into any show stopping issues that would make you regret updating. There are a few more technical changes that users of certain apps might want to be aware of (Mishaal Rahman put together a handy list of 50 important changes in this Reddit post), but most people will be able to update without worry. Enroll in the Android Beta program. The first step is to enroll in Google's Android Beta program, which has allowed adventurous Pixel owners (as well as developers) to test the new software all summer. But since the final version of Android 13 is now out, if you enroll today, you won't receive a beta build. It will be the same version of Android that Google is slowly rolling out to everyone. Go to the Android Beta program website on any device with a browser (including your phone) and log in to the same Google account that your phone uses. At the top is a button to "see eligible devices." Tap that and the page will scroll to the bottom, where you'll hopefully see your Pixel phone. You can then hit the "Opt in" button to join the beta. A window will pop up, and you'll have to agree to the terms and conditions of the program and then press Confirm and Enroll. But there I ran into to other problems like "partition table doesn't exist's". So it's like no luck with this MIA1. So whats nexr? Well I never used MiFlash tools. I install the images directly with fastboot. There are executables (.bat for Windows and .sh for Linux & Mac) inside the zip file so you don't even have to worry about typing the right commands. On Windows (I'm not sure) you have to put a fastboot.exe file inside the unzipped folder, put the phone in fastboot mode, double click on one of the .bat files and wait until it reboots. There's plenty of tutorials around though. Please someone correct me if I'm wrong because I'm not a Windows user. True, I have also seen this method but couldn't find the right tutorial how it exactly works without damaging my device. So if someone could post a clearly way how to walk this one trough! Maybe you have a Mi 5x instead [MIUI]. JIRC the latest unofficial ported Android one for the Mi5x is from August. Mine was stuck on 7.1.2, December, tried the method no.1 and it worked like a charm. Update came to me without any bugs. But I will get away from 3rd method, just for my security reasons. If first 2 will not work for you, just wait when it will come naturally. I'm owning this phone for two days only but I've read on some Serbian forums that some people had to try upgrading for some time and once it just worked. Sent from my Mi A1 using Tapataik pro Method 1 worked for me, no clearing cache required. I checked for update manually after reboot while Google services framework was still disabled. This let Google play services to crash (I received an error message). Then I re-enabled Google services framework. Immediately afterwards I received the message that an update was available. Yeah, that's right. Got the crash error, too. Sent from my Mi A1 using Tapataik pro Yeah, that's right. Got the crash error, too. Thanks guys, the crash error is what I needed as well. I disabled framework, restarted phone, then went to update and had to check for update 5-6 times until I got play store to crash, then enabled framework and got the notification for a new 89 mb update. Hello everyone if any method is not working for you, you can try the crashing method as proposed by some people above, just disable gsf > reboot device > check for updates >crash > enable gsf > check for updates. There were no fakes of A1 reported as far as I know, "only" reflashed 5x sold as A1. I bought it in alexpress. I'm not in Saudi Arab. What to do? As long as you wanted A1 4GB/64GB black version, region shouldn't really matter. Region is mainly to make sure that you have official device and not grey import (if you buy it locally). So you have 5x device, head over to 5x forum for guides. You can't flash official A1 ROM. Thank you Mysiak, happy with your support. So you think it's a 5x even so it says MIA1 in my status settings. I'll look for M5 flash rom and see how it goes. Thank. I'm pretty sure that you really have 5x, because: 1. you are stuck on August update, no OTA received 2. all attempts for flashing A1 ROM fail 3. flashing A/B partitions gives error "partition doesn't exist" 4. and the most important, official IMEI verification tool shows their internal records and that this device was manufactured as 5x Seller flashed it with A1 ROM for whatever reason (high demand and low supply of A1s, higher profit as 5x is cheaper...). If possible, contact the seller and demand a refund as you were basically cheated. Of course, unless you prefer 5x with MIUI.. I've tried the disable-google-framework method. It worked. But after I restarted my device, the update wasn't there anymore. I checked on the system update, but the update was completely gone. Lol it doesn't matter to me, tho

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
