Once the batteries are recharged, they can be placed in any electronic device that uses AA or AAA batteries, such as digital cameras and toys. The prongs fold in so they lay flat against the charger when its not in use. The red LED light on the charger will appear, indicating that the battery is charging.

If the LED light is flashing, there is a malfunction and the batteries arent charging. The charging process can take anywhere from 15 minutes to two hours, depending on how many batteries are being recharged, the battery cell capacity, the condition of the batteries and the temperature. Full charge on a battery never lasted me for more than couple days of use. I went back to using Duracells alkalines because they lasted much longer and performed much better than these rechargeables. It does recharge batteries, but the recharged batteries never last half as much as Duracells own cheap alkalines. I bought Sony charger, they last longer and perform much better. Comes with 6 AAs and 2 AAAs, so they get you started right off with a few batteries to use, which is nice. Unpacked everything the plastic package is difficult to open up, so be careful and plugged it in. There is a cooling fan built in which moves air across the batteries during charging, so just make sure you dont rest the charger where the airflow is blocked e.g. on carpet. Within the stated 15 minutes, the batteries were done and tested out at 1.2 volts on my voltmeter. Put the batteries in my flash and took several dozen pictures that night without any problems. Have yet to really give them an extreme durability test, but overall seems like its working fine so far. The light will turn on, then start flashing indicating that there is a problem and that the batteries are not charging. Out of 4 existing older NiMH batteries I own, only 2 of them can be charged by this charger. I suspect that

brand new batteries will not have this problem. It charged my old batteries also within 15 minutes, and these old batts tested out at 1.2 volts again with my voltmeter. The package does not indicate this requirement, either. I did note that other competing chargers on the market will only give you 15 min charge times if you use special IC3 batteries. Not so with this charger, in my experience so far.

Nowhere on the package does it tell you what input voltages the charger supports, so I flipped it over and read the label on the unit. It requires 100 to 120 volt input, so if you plan on using this overseas, you should bring along a voltage converter with you. US voltage input only. The unit is a little bulky, so if you are going on vacation, youll probably have to pack it in your luggage, not in your camera case my existing 14 hour overnight charger is small enough to be toted in my camera case today. It comes with a cable to plug into a wall socket or an adapter for car use. The instructions do say that if you charge batteries from a car, it will take longer than 15 minutes. I have not tried this yet and dont know exactly how long it will take. Overall, I am happy with the purchase and would recommend this unit to anyone looking to turn AA charge times around guickly, particularly any professional photographers who use these in their external flash units. Dec 2006 I forgot to add something. With this unit, you can charge from 1 to 4 batteries at a time, your choice. The moment you pop in 1 battery, assuming the units plugged into the wall or your car, itll start charging. Very flexible! As a followup, have used it several times now with good results, still very happy with this charger. March 2011 Well, here we are, nearly 5 years after I wrote my initial review. I just wanted to pop back in here and mention that the original Duracell batteries that shipped with this product have pretty much given up their lifespan after nearly 5 years of good service, I feel I definitely got my moneys worth out of these batteries. They no longer charge in the fast charger, but they outperformed some other generic NiMH batteries I bought around the same time to use in my flash unit. These Duracell batteries have been all around the globe with me since my initial purchase, and I am overall very pleased with how they worked out.

I was very excited to see that this charger does, indeed, take merely 15 minutes to charge. Batteries that I charged and then saved for a day or so to use later were completely dead by the time I put them in my camera. This happened to both my older batteries and the batteries that came with this charger. The longer I used this charger, the less powerful my batteries became. My friend had been using my charger occasionally, too, and he discovered his batteries were also losing power. We considered that maybe the charger was just wearing out, but when we tried charging the same batteries using his 12hour charger, it was of no use. So, while this charger is very convenient for travel and lastminute charging, dont burn your batteries out on it. I suggest you alternate it with a less powerful charger for longer battery life. Please try again later. I began using the precharged batteries in my Wii controllers, since the charger would not charge them further. The wiimotes registered the batteries as having a half charge, and when they died, the charger refused to charge them. It seems the intelligence Duracell put into this charger is completely insane. It tells me that dead batteries are charged, and refuses to charge them. Since it took me awhile to go thru all 8 batteries, I am outside of Best Buys 30 day warranty. I have no idea how anything this bad got through any kind of quality assurance process. A coworker was able to charge the batteries to maximum charge in a normal slow Sony charger that came with her digital camera. Although I still have a faulty charger, I do appreciate their gesture. Vasiliauskas 4.0 out of 5 stars I am planning to travel to Europe and it was important to me that the charger would be compatible with 220V. Duracell website clearly states that voltage converter is not

required as all Duracell chargers have voltage input rating of 100240V. To my biggest surprise, after opening the package, the power plug for the adapter has the voltage rating of 100120V. I knew Energizer charger was rated for only 100120V voltage input, but I went with Duracell because of the worldwide voltage compatibility. Before returning this charger to the store, however, I have decided to call Duracell customer service line listed on their website. The customer service representative apparently knew exactly what I was talking about. According to the Duracell customer service representative, these 15 minute Duracell chargers were intended for the sale in the USA only thus the reason for the label on the power adapter 100120V, but, according to her, it is compatible with 220V voltage input as well. I was told not to worry and use it with 220V it is safe. I guess I will just have to trust Duracell and try it out when I am in Europe. Even as soon as they are done charging now they probably only charge to 60 percent capacity, and die very quickly. I couldnt believe it. I have had great success with NiHM batteries in the past, but this is ridiculous. I spent hours online, researching battery technology and chargers to find out that any charger that charges your batteries faster than one our SEVERELY DECREASES THE LIFESPAN of your batteries.

I purchased a set of Eneloop batteries which hold a charge much longer than any other NiMH batteries on the market. I will be contacting Duracell to find out if I can get replacement batteries for the small fortune I have lost on these. Dont get me wrong, its not the batteries that have the problem. Duracell makes great batteries. Its their pathetic charger that killed them all. Unfortunately, people review these products and give them five star ratings without owning them for more than a few months. Sometimes when I switch on the charger the two red lights which normally how steady red when charging and change to green when fully charged flash on and off. Even when I change the batteries around, one or both red lights flash rather than showing a steady red. A flashing red LED light indicates that the charger detects abnormal batteries or the battery temperature is abnormal. When the light is a solid green, the batteries have completed their charge.

kiloran I plead guilty for not trying to google the solution. I am puzzled about the reference to faulty batteries because this is occurring with Duracell batteries that are new or little used. I greatly appreciate your very prompt and helpful reply. Jon It is I understand possible that when the least charged cell discharges, the remaining cells, through their continuing to force current through the discharged cell, impose a reverse voltage polarity on it. If you then stick said cell in an intelligent charger it could conceivably detect this state and issue a warning. We humans often gather up cells and bung them in things with no thought for the relative state of charge of the individual cells. This can lead AIUI to such effects. To start viewing messages, Someone told us we needed extendedlife batteries and so we went out and bought the Duracell 15 minute rechargeable kit at Target. When I got home I put the 4 x 2400mah batteries into the charger and the red light came on and the fan turned on. I was expecting the red light and fan to turn off after 15 minutes, but it continued for about 60 minutes and then the red light turned off fan continued.

Would appreciate any definitive comments, especially from someone who had similar results with their CEF15NC. And if the batteries did take a long time when charging for the first time, did they take 15 minutes to charge after that. Or do I have to return this kit as nonfunctioning. We hope not because it was a long bit of traveling. Thank you. I normally do that and cycle them on other chargers first. It may just be because they are new. Id suggest just using them in your camera and watch them on the next charge. If they take 60 minutes again, you may have a problem. Actually these 15 minutes are rated at that fast time with lower capacity cells, so 15 minutes for 2400mAh cells is a bit of BS. You should wait till at least the cooling fan stops too. Oh, yes it does require a few cycles to reach full capacity. After the red light went out, the fan was still running. When we removed the 4 batteries, a second or two later the fan stopped. This is the first time we have ever had a charger or MAH rechargeable batteries and so, we are completely unaware of what might be going on, or why it took so long for the initial charge. Thank you. First question Did the batteries get hot. I would use the batteries and recharge them 23 times. You should end up with charging times in the 1520 minute range. If you dont, take it back. I might also add that you may want to set the charger on a noncombustible surface and monitor the charge. You can touch the batteries from time to time. If they approach the temperature of a baked potato 140 F shut things down and let things cool off. Most batteries dont die they are tortured to near death, then murdered. When i first got my Energizer 15 min charger it only took 15 min to charge 2000mAh cells and i was worried that that

was too fast What i found out was the current was appropriate, and not the value stamped on the charger base so all is well.

If, on the other hand, it took 60 minutes to charge i think i would discharge the cells by using them in a flashlight and then measure the charge current. I would then calculate the required time to charge knowing this charge current and the rating of the cells. Since it is 60 mins and not 15 that is quite a difference so i would expect to see a much lower current than is needed to do the job in a real 15 minutes. If this was the case, i would take the unit back. I dont know if you are equipped to measure current though are you Almost forgot to mention It is normal on the E15 for the fan to run after the cells are done charging this is apparently to cool the cells down after that fast charge. I leave my cells in for a time after the charge because they get nice and cool with that fan running on them. Got Light As we mentioned, we are completely new to this and very confused at this point.
