The steel shafts wear and bend too easily. If you intend to race your Nitro Evader BX Buggy model at a competitive level, I would also recommend you obtain and fit titanium pivot shafts, turnbuckles, tie rods and steering rods. A thin coat of grease is often used on internal gears and although this is fine for basic running around on the back yard, if you intend to race your Buggy at a higher level, this should be removed and replaced with racing oil ZX1 or Teflon Oil. Of course, this should be reapplied after each race meeting. Head on collisions can easily damage the gear teeth on nylon and plastic spur gears. Heavy impacts can also loosen the nuts or self tapping screws that hold the Nitro Engine in Position, allowing the pinion gear to pull out of mesh slightly and rip the tops off the teeth on your spur gear. To minimise this possibility, fit bolts with locking nuts to the Nitro Engine mount and remember to check them for security after every two or three runs. A simple thing like a loose fitting connector popping off could easily end your race, so better safe than sorry. Check out my Servo Information article. Dust and grit can get into these bearings and abrade the shafts. Therefore, you should replace them all with shielded ball bearings. To start the engine, a battery powered Starter, or Glow Igniter, is connected to the Glow Plug and electric current heats the coil to white hot, so that when you pull start your engine, the air fuel mixture in the cylinder is ignited. With the engine now running, the starter is no longer required. Heat generated under compression is enough to keep the coil element hot enough to keep the engine running. To test your Glow Plug, remove it from the cylinder head and place it in the igniter. If the coil instantly glows bright orange, the plug is healthy, a weak or no glow at all, indicates probable burn out. To prevent going through this whole poopy process, follow the new instructions for break in. The Evader itself has a little advertised 90 day bumper to bumper warranty in addition to the 1yr stress tech. Flooding your

engine is a quick way to break your starter due to hydrolocking. Your oneway bearing insider the pullstart wont take much abuse at all.

If your cord is broke, youre probably pulling the thing too hard and too far. You should be taking very short maybe 6 inch pulls. Okay, so your cord isnt broke. Pull it and listen to the pullstart. Its not fun to try to put it back together. I used a bent paperclip to pull the oneway bearing out of the spindle. Contributed by Everyone Evader Parts Dude. There have been tips on how to fix this with a rubber band, but I dont think thats too great of an idea. The best bet is to get a better tank. However, if youre on a budget, you could always try the rubber band idea. Just take the tank off and toss a few highly wrapped rubber bands on it. You can put a zip tie on the rubber bands so they are easier to pull away from the lid. Its a good idea to fix this soon, as youll dirty your ride up in a jiffy with gas leaking all over it. The stock setting doesnt have much give even if its completely loose. Starting Problems Just like the manual says, try starting the engine at 50% throttle. If your carb is out of tune, just turn the radio gear off, plug your glow igniter in, and use a finger to open up the carb by pushing on the servo horn. Another thing I noticed is that it totally hates slightlygoing glowplugs or batteries. Its a very finicky motor. Notch the lip the width of the wire for the failsafe, then notch out the same width on the cover in the same spot. If you plan on running your vehicle in cold weather below 45 degrees F, you may experience parts breaking easier than under normal operating conditions. If you must run in cold temperatures below 45 degrees F, one option to help limit breakage and increase the toughness of nylon parts chassis, suspension arms, bulkheads, etc. is by disassembling the vehicle and boiling only the nylon parts for 2 hours.

This will cause the nylon parts to be more flexible than usual. Wait for the nylon parts to cool completely before reassembling. This will not solve all problems in cold weather running. If its all in the same format people will be able to find their problems a lot easier. Should help all those evader guys out there.Sadly, Id rather take the stupid time to pull the plug.Send him your engine and ask him to send it in for you. Give him a few bucks for it. Not sure if thats too practical or not. This conversion makes your engine more reliable and longer lasting. I have done this swap to the DTX.18 myself, and it works great. Contact your local importer first then if you dont have any luck email the guys in the States. It should only take between 610 tanks of fuel before it is fully broken in. Your needle will be around 2 turns out from close but it will vary depending on the engine. Do not let your engine run at idle for very long until it has been broken in completely. Idling during breakin will cause the parts to breakin at too low of a temp and will cause eventual failure when engine gets hotter. One screw is on the part of the carb that movesidle screw maybe Theres a small one with a spring on it, and the main one that the fuel line basically comes off of any help would be greatly appreciated! thanksYou sure it is not a Nitro Evader ST. The one with the spring on it should be the Idle Set Screw. The one you refer to as the main one, is you HSNhigh Needle. The one that is left on the rotary part of the carb is you LSN. First step is to get it to start. I dont know the factory settings for that carb. If it starts the just make sure it is spitting fuel out the stinger and go from there. I like to start with the HSN and monitor my temps. I dont like to tune by temp but it will get you to a safe zone. Once you have the HSN close then move to the LSN. If you pinch the fuel line were it enters the carb and it revs up and dies immediately then the LSN is lean. I like for it to run 45 seconds after pinching fuel line. I would also put a fresh glow plug in it. Hope this helps. T.As far as the idle issue. I would make sure the idle gap is not too wide. See if there is anything in that manual about idle gap. Pull off the air filter. The gap should be pretty small. If it seems like it is open alot the turn down idle and play with you LSN. This is kinda tough over a forum. Then we get into air leaks.
